



Book Recommendations (Bibles for Kids and Books for Adults)


Below you will find a list of books that I have found helpful or that I am planning to read that I thought you might find helpful. I will be adding to this as I find new books!





If you want your kids to learn 52 Scriptures every kid should know: **I Can Learn the Bible** by Holly Hawkins Shivers






If you want to learn about classic spiritual practices and how to incorporate them into your life: **The Sacred Way** by Tony Jones (I love this one!)




