Colossians 3:5-14

⁵Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry. ⁶Because of these, the wrath of God is coming. ⁷You used to walk in these ways, in the life you once lived. ⁸But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips. ⁹Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices ¹⁰and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator. ¹¹Here there is no Gentile or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave or free, but Christ is all, and is in all. ¹²Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. ¹³Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. ¹⁴And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.

Worship Words

Throughout Lent, we often focus on the self-reflective ways we have fallen short of God's desire for our lives and His love for us. We linger in the space of what we have done wrong or left undone. While it is important for us to name these hindrances and shortcomings in a confessional spirit, we often let this overtake the subtle and brewing hopefulness that lies growing beneath the doom and gloom of Lent and Holy Week. In today's worship message, as Paul writes to the Church at Colossae, he admonishes them from their sinful ways but also encourages them with a hopeful message of being God's chosen people and how to live into that claim. As you worship this Lenten season, remember while you are dust, God has breathed life into you to turn from your sin and follow Him, to be God's people bonded together in love.

Narthex Display

On the Fourth Sunday of Lent, we follow Jesus as He is betrayed and arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane. Having left the Last Supper early, Judas led the Pharisees to the garden to arrest Jesus for thirty pieces of silver. Judas signaled to the Pharisees whom to arrest by greeting Jesus with a kiss, a symbol of great love, yet ultimate betrayal. This began Jesus' physical suffering in his last week leading to His crucifixion. As the apostles followed the soldiers who arrested Jesus, Peter denied Him three times. Judas realizing that Jesus' fate was death not just imprisonment, became disillusioned and returned his thirty pieces of silver. But, it was too late to stop the religious leaders from killing Jesus. He is on His way to the certain outcome of His trial ... crucifixion.
