

While it's not our formal custom to celebrate each Sunday of the Christmas and Epiphany seasons, it's our solemn hope that Christ's birth, the Hope of Peace, Joy and Love that Christ brings to our lives, and the response of all who would come to see and know the birth of Jesus may outlast these seasons and abide in your heart throughout the year.
