## Worship Words

Today in our worship service, we pay special attention and notice to the liturgical calendar and the importance of this day in the life of “the church.” Today, we harken back to the day in 1517 when Dr. Martin Luther nailed his Ninety-Five Theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany, triggering the start of reforms and changes in the church which has had major and lasting impacts in Christian thought, theology, and practice since then over the past 507 years. As we worship, we offer the hymn, “A Mighty Fortress Is Our God,” arguably Luther’s most noted hymn” as recognition of God’s work in and through this important moment in the practice of our faith.

During our current worship series, “Risk Something Big for Something Good,” we’re spending some intentional time focusing, thinking, and reflecting on stewardship. What do you think of when you hear the word “stewardship”? Maybe for you it immediately turns your thoughts to the idea of giving. What are we giving, and to whom are we giving? Is it our tithes and offerings? Is it your time? Is it the talents and the gifts that God has given to you? Maybe it’s all three, and more! In and through our stewardship, God calls and works to help us be found more faithful as God’s disciples - offering from what we have to give back to the one who has given it to us. We give of ourselves, not just to return something back to God, but to give and share with each other - to be the hands and feet of Christ, to speak Christ, to share Christ with each other and the world through what God has given to us. During these weeks, how will you dedicate - how will you recommit - to this active discipleship - to being a faithful steward in your life for God?
