Maundy Thursday Tenebrae, April 17 at 7 PM

Often referred to as a "service of shadows," woven together through a scriptural dramatization, this Tenebrae service recalls Jesus' final moments, as we remember and partake in the Lord's Supper before moving to Jesus' crucifixion, death, and burial. As the service progresses, darkness grows as we extinguish candles before culminating in our recessional to veil the cross on our front lawn.

Easter Sunday, April 20 at 8:30 & 11 AM

Rejoice in the resurrection of Christ as we proclaim, "Christ is Risen! He Is Risen Indeed!" through word and song. At 8:30 AM, join the celebration led by soloists and instruments. At 11:00 AM, the combined voices and instruments of our Music & Worship Ministry lead us as we exclaim, "Alleluia!"
