

Worship Words

Like every Sunday, we as worshippers bring all of ourselves, in the context of the world in which we live with us into this sacred space. When we worship, likewise, we offer ourselves and our liturgy to God in the context of the day. However, it’s not our world that informs our worship; rather, it is our worship that transforms us for our world. On this day, in the context of our national holiday in which we celebrate our freedom and independence, it is a right and holy thing to offer our gratitude and thanksgiving to God for the liberties we enjoy while we remember and celebrate countless names and faces who have helped to bring us here as a country. Yet, our faith is not formed by our national mood or action; difficulty, our mood, attitude, and inaction have led our nation into darker days more often in our history than we like to admit. Instead, our faith is informed by the love of God and the kingdom of God, which transcends any allegiance we could have in this world. And it is our worship of God in God’s church for God’s kingdom in which we are redeemed and transformed to take our faith back to our nation into the context of the day in which we are called. Today, as we worship, while we echo the testimonies of witnesses who gave language to our national vocabulary, we must remember that today, and every day, belongs to the kingdom of God, and that our celebrations, our attitudes, and our actions are given to the glory of God alone.
